Leviticus 23:15 ¶And ye shall count unto you from the morrow after the sabbath, from the day that ye brought the sheaf of the wave offering; **seven sabbaths shall be complete:**

¹⁶ Even unto the morrow after the seventh sabbath shall ye number fifty days; and ye shall offer a new meat offering unto the LORD.

April 11 (30th or day after the last Sabbath of the month was a “non-day” and was not counted as a work day. It was treated however as a feast day; an example being when David was supposed to be at the king’s table for two days where Saul’s son was covering for him.

Following the instructions of Lev. 23:15 and how they used their calendar, Pentecost this year would have fallen on May 19th, IF the new moon days were viewed as such.

In 359 AD (CE) Rabbi Hillel II put in place a calendar of his that switched to fixed weeks like most other calendars by then. Because of this, holy days and Sabbaths could conflict, so he created “postponements” to adjust the days. Note for example the Hebrews were to acquire a lamb on the 10th of the month prior to the Passover, but now, that could happen on a Sabbath/ Saturday.
